Purple WiFi – Using WiFi in Public Places

June 2014

The following document offers an overview of the Purple WiFi survey data collected from 2,540 consumers that use Public WiFi between March and May 2014.

Summary

Key findings

- 1. 72% of respondents use WiFi in a public place.
- 2. Of those that do not use Public WiFi, 12% do not know how to access WiFi, 9% refuse to access WiFi because the registration process is too long, and 27% were concerned about security issues.
- 3. 78% of respondents specifically look for Free WiFi connections when out in public places.
- 4. 77% of people are more likely to go to a location if it offers free WiFi. This number falls to 6% if the WiFi is paid (6% of respondent would be more likely to visit a venue if it offered any WiFi free or paid).
- 5. 75% of respondents are more likely to stay in a location longer if it offers some sort of WiFi.
- 6. 63% are more likely to spend additional money in a venue that offers WiFi.
- 7. 48% of people use public WiFi at least once a week and 17% use Public WiFi at least once a day.
- 8. 56% of respondents use public WiFi for up to 30 minutes, with 38% using it for up to 1.5 hours, and 7% going over 1.5 hours.
- When asked what they use Public WiFi for, the respondents confirmed; 17% do banking, 87% check emails, 69% update their social profiles, 63% browse the web, 27% use public WiFi for work purposes and 14% look at video content.
- 10. When asked what would improve their public WiFi experience, the respondents answered; Easy login process 39%, Free WiFi 36% and Faster WiFi 25%.
- 11. When asked if they would pay for faster WiFi, 44% said yes, 23% of whom confirmed only if they needed a stronger connection to use a bandwidth intensive file or application, e.g. to watch video content.
- 12. When asked if content filtering should be a legal requirement in public locations, 56% said yes, and a further 26% said it would depend on the venue.


- 13. When asked what would make them more likely to use WiFi in public places, the respondents confirmed:
 - If it was easier to access
 - If it was faster
 - Reduced cost of using mobile devices
 - To access offers / vouchers
 - To ensure inappropriate content is filtered out.
- 14. When asked 'how do you get online once you've selected a network', 54% of respondents said they were automatically connected, 7% confirmed they switch off and on again to activate the connection, 5% said they didn't know.


Question 1: Gender







Question 5: Do you look for a location that has free WiFi when out in public places?







Question 7: Are you more likely to stay longer in a venue that does offer WiFi?




Question 8: Are you likely to spend more money in a venue that offers WiFi?

Question 9: How often do you use free WiFi in public places?



Question 10: On average, how long do you use WiFi in public places?







Question 13: If you were given the choice of a free connection with limited bandwidth, or a paid connection with stronger bandwidth, would you consider paying?















Question 19: What does a network with a padlock mean?


